What you are encouraged to do in reading this, is to recognise that from a single situation that occurred in an occupational therapy group, multiple interpretations of 'what happened' and the meaning of what happened, depends on the 'lens' that is applied. In this case, that lens comes from theory. 'Naming and framing' of issues informs the ways that a response to the issues is generated.
